

- I. Her condition, vs. 25-26.
 - A. She was diseased and discouraged, vs. 25.
 1. And a certain woman, which had an issue of blood twelve years, vs. 25.
 - B. She was desperate and destitute, vs. 26.
 1. And had suffered many things of many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was nothing bettered, but rather grew worse, vs. 26.
- II. Her cure, vs. 27-34.
 - A. She trusted Jesus, vs. 27-28.
 1. ...came in the press... vs. 27. For she said, If I may touch but his clothes... vs. 28.
 2. ...she had heard...came... vs. 27.
 3. So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God. Romans 10:17.
 - B. She touched Jesus, vs. 27.
 1. ...and touched his garment., vs. 27.
 2. And his disciples said unto him, Thou seest the multitude thronging thee, and sayest thou, Who touched me? vs. 31.
 3. And Jesus, immediately knowing in himself that virtue had gone out of him, turned him about in the press, and said, Who touched my clothes? vs. 30.
 4. ...go in peace, and be whole of thy plague., vs. 34.
 5. ...came...fell down...told him all the truth., vs. 33.
