

Facts About the Lord's Supper I Corinthians 11:22-34

I Corinthians 11:19-22 For there must be also heresies among you, that they which are approved may be made manifest among you. When ye come together therefore into one place, this is not to eat the Lord's supper. For in eating every one taketh before other his own supper: and one is hungry, and another is drunken. What? have ye not houses to eat and to drink in? or despise ye the church of God, and shame them that have not? What shall I say to you? shall I praise you in this? I praise you not.

I. Significance of the Lord's Supper, vs. 23-26.

A. When it was instituted, vs. 23.

1. ...That the Lord Jesus the same night...

vs. 23.

B. Why it was instituted, vs. 23-26.

1. ...took bread: vs. 23 ...took the cup... vs. 25 ... shew the Lord's death... vs. 26.

2. John 17:1 These words spake Jesus, and lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, Father, the hour is come; glorify thy Son, that thy Son also may glorify thee:

3. Matthew 26:27-29 And he took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all of it; For this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many for the remission of sins. But I say unto you, I will not drink henceforth of this fruit of the vine, until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom.

4. ...till he come., vs. 26.

II. The seriousness of the Lord's Supper, vs. 27-30.

A. Paul's way to the table, vs. 27.

1. ... whosoever shall eat this bread, and drink this cup of the Lord, unworthily, shall be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord., vs. 27.

2. ...let a man examine himself... vs. 28.

B. Paul's warning from the table, vs. 29-30.

1. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily... vs. 29

2. ...many are weak and sickly among you, and many sleep., vs. 30.

3. For if we would judge ourselves, we should not be judged., vs. 31.
